October - December 2024 Training Topics and Descriptions



Courses marked with this symbol are courses required to meet the voluntary, Child Care Credential/Specializations criteria.

<u>ACES 103: Preventing Adverse Childhood Experiences</u>: Child Growth and Development; Health, Safety and Nutrition (Beginner)

Preventing Adverse Childhood Experiences, presented by Carrie Frasch, will provide an overview of adverse childhood experiences and the impact of trauma. It will also help you identify some of the root causes of adverse childhood experiences and look at the best practices for preventing ACEs through individuals, families, schools, and communities.

<u>Early Learning Standards Framework: I/T with Lesson Planning:</u> Child Growth and Development (Intermediate)



This six-hour module series with Traci Busch is broken into 3, 2-hour sessions. These courses will provide an opportunity to explore the WV Early Learning Standards Framework for Infants and Toddlers by focusing on two developmental domains each session. Each session will discuss the purpose, content, application, and benefits of the learning standards, as well as how to incorporate each domain into a

lesson plan. By the end of the module series, participants will have a detailed understanding of how the Early Learning Standards work and how to incorporate them into a complete lesson plan for infants and toddlers. Upon completion of the module series, participants will be eligible for up to \$250 in resources directly related to the WV ELSF: I/T.

<u>Understanding ECERS-3:</u> Environment and Curriculum; Professionalism and Leadership (Beginner)

This course, by Jessie Lambert, provides an overview of the Early Childhood Environment Rating Scale, 3rd Edition (ECERS-3) including purpose, content, scoring, and tips for observing. This tool is used in Center-based programs caring for children 3 – 5 years old.

Emergency Preparedness for Family Child Care: Health, Safety and Nutrition (Beginner)



In this session with Sami Cochran, participants will learn discuss the types of emergencies that have and can occur while children are in care and planning needed to keep children and workers safe during those events. Participants will receive support in creating the required emergency preparedness action plan.

<u>Family Childcare Positive Behavior Intervention Support:</u> Child Growth and Development; Environment and Curriculum; Professionalism and Leadership (Intermediate)



Join Meredith Lester for this 3-part module series for family child care providers that will examine the pyramid model and intervention strategies, including having difficult conversations with parents. You must attend all three sessions to receive credit.

<u>How to Use Board Games in Your Classroom:</u> Child Growth and Development; Environment and Curriculum (Intermediate)

During this 2-hour course with Sami Cochran, participants will be learning what board games are, different types of board games, the benefits of each type of board game and how to use games in the early childhood classroom. We will be playing games as well. Come join this interactive session as we learn how and what to do to help the children in our care develop.

<u>Stereotypes:</u> Family and Community Relationships; Environment and Curriculum; Health, Safety and Nutrition; Professionalism and Leadership; Administration and Management (Beginner)

This session with Jessie Lambert will cover different types of Stereotyping, how/why this affects us at work, and knowledge on avoiding them.

<u>Teaching Children to Resolve Conflicts:</u> Child Growth and Development; Environment and Curriculum (Beginner) Children are going to engage in conflict, for reasons such as two children wanting to play with the same toy or a child feeling like something is unfair. In this training, by Carrie Frasch, we will discuss techniques you can use to help children prevent and effectively resolve conflicts.

The Growing Brain: Various Core Knowledge Areas (Beginner)



This 7-session series delves into research in brain development and strategies for childcare providers to support the growing brains of children, birth to 5 years old. The crucial development of the growing brain is one of the most important topics in early childhood development. Research on the topic is exploding,

underscoring the need for early childhood professionals to stay up to date on brain development and strategies to best support the growing brains of children, birth to 5 years old, in their care.

<u>WVIT 2: Relationship Based Care for Administrators:</u> Administration and Management; Professionalism and Leadership (Advanced)



This is a 6-hour course intended to provide administrators with an overview of the WVIT Professional Development Program for Infants and Toddlers (Relationship Based Care) WVIT II. This course will provide an overview of the content covered in the caregiver classroom session and practicum assignments, as well

as strategies to support caregivers as they implement new practices. They will address competency-based training and will learn about policies and procedures associated with the WVIT program and the incentive system. All child care administrators are encouraged to attend. You can register by contacting Traci Busch at (304) 637-2840.

WVIT 2: Relationship Based Care for Caregivers: All Core Knowledge Areas (Advanced)



The WVIT Professional Development Program for Caregivers Relationship Based Care consists of a 45-hour course for caregivers (10 sessions and a practicum) that is broken into three Modules that focus on relationship-based care. Participation in this professional development program focuses on the heart of quality care – the relationship of the caregiver with the child, the child's family and with colleagues.

Through this course caregivers have the opportunity to examine the relationships in their infant/toddler programs and learn strategies for strengthening and assessing the quality of their programs with respect to those relationships. This course provides the knowledge and skills needed to implement relationship-based care and to mentor and coach other infant/toddler professionals in their centers. You must have completed WVIT 1 in order to attend. You can register by contacting Traci Busch at (304) 637-2840.

Quality Environments: FCCERS-3: Environment and Curriculum; Administration and Management (Beginner)
This training, offered by Melissa Hutson and Brenda Epperley, will introduce family child care providers to the Family
Child Care Environment Rating Scale. The training will discuss how the FCCERS-3 is used in environments, why WV uses
the scale and how it relates to the Tiered Reimbursement Program in WV. Family child care providers will get a basic
understanding for the FCCERS-3 and be presented with an opportunity for further training in this area.

Training Topic	Summary
Communicable Diseases	Tips for minimizing the spread of infection in programs as well as information about common communicable diseases.
Respiratory Infections	Basic information about the anatomy of the respiratory system and how it functions. Also includes information relating to many common infections including colds, influenza, and RSV
All About Seizures	This training provides information about recognizing types of seizures, basic first aid for seizures, recognizing medical emergencies and medication administration for seizures.
Rashes &	Information about various skin conditions that young children experience.
Scratches	
Medication	Participants will be introduced to safe medication handling and administration practices. This training
Administration	is required for providers to administer medication to children in the childcare setting.
Child Care Credential	
Infection	Basic information about infection control concerns in the childcare setting. Information provided
Control	includes hand washing, sanitation and disinfection principles, and universal/standard precautions.
Oral Health	This training provides participants with information about the importance of starting oral care at a young age, teething and other considerations for infants. Also includes information about oral care for children with medical considerations and first aid for dental emergencies

Earn Your Breastfeeding-Friendly Child Care Designation

The West Virginia Breastfeeding-Friendly Child Care Designation (BFCCD) is a voluntary program that offers resources to child care providers who support breastfeeding mothers. The designation is open to all licensed child care centers, registered facilities and family child care providers who choose to participate. Providers who enroll in this initiative will receive support from Infant/Toddler Coaching Specialists, Child Care Nurse Health Consultants, and Child Care Health Educators. Upon completion of the 10-step process, your site will receive materials to support start up, a certificate of designation, and a stipend.
